2.- Universitat de Girona will send its decision within 2 weeks from the student's application date.

3.-Transcript of records

Universitat de Girona issues the Transcript of Records according to the final mark submission date. That means:

For the 1st semester students (Autumn term, from Sept. to February): 1rst half of March

For the 2nd semester students (Spring term, from February to June): 1rst half of July

For the whole academic year (from Sept. to June 2014): 1rst half of July

Yildiz Technical University: A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [4] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination of the agreement, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."
